

**SECTOR SIX GOAL SETTING- PRIORITIES**  
**May 12, 2008**

**Public Safety**

**Original Goal: Increase safety in Sector 6.**

**Question: What are the top public safety issues that need to be addressed in Sector Six?**

**Key:** Each item mentioned at the brainstorming is included. Similar ideas are grouped, separated by “/”. Items getting votes (blue dots) have score in “( )”  
**Score** = Number of times an idea was proposed + votes for the idea  
**Sample goal statements** are written for the top scorers and are a first draft of a goal to be included in the final plan.

- Consistent Police Presence: Walking, Biking, etc./ Visibility of public safety officers/ Police officers assigned to neighborhoods(6)/ Not enough police visibility/ More opportunities to meet the police that patrol the area, socials, officer friendly in schools(5)/ More foot patrols (2) – **Score = 19**  
**Sample Goal Statement: Create a community where police and public safety personnel are a part of the daily life of the community.**
  
- Improve Group Pac-Tac Walks/ Need more pac tac (1)/ Increase number of pac tac volunteers (1)/ More Pac-tac (1)/ More pac-tac (4)/Neighborhood watch/Neighborhood pride/involvement (3)/Court watch/ Merchants: Need more walks in commercial strips – **Score = 19**  
**Sample Goal Statement: Increase participation of community members in public safety related activities.**
  
- Increase youth programs vis-à-vis involvement in the community/ Negative relations between youth/cops (1)/ Positive youth activities, balance off youth problems (2)/ Increase number of big brother/big sister groups/Things for kids to do (3)/Bring back, police/athletic leagues/ Opportunity for youth to voice problems to get help and support – **Score = 16**
  
- Easier system to report activity/Education about reporting, response(1)/Need to call 911/ Share info, communication/ Promote PCIC – more of it/ Safety meetings/Report all incidents/ Safety education – **Score = 9**
  
- Increased graffiti removal (4)/ Graffiti – **Score = 6**
  
- Anti violence conflict resolution (4) – **Score = 5**
  
- Surveillance Cameras/ Portable cameras/ Need for more security cameras (1) – **Score = 4**
  
- Repeat initiative (or find ways to) get illegal weapons off the street/Illegal weapons(problem)/ Gun drop-off locations (1) – **Score = 4**
  
- Drugs (1)/ Drugs (1) – **Score = 4**

- Perception of crime/ Perception of safety, exaggeration/Perception of Alexander to downtown as a drug area/Accurate portrayal of crime – **Score = 4**
- Greater awareness/enforcement of nuisance crimes/ Enforceable noise ordinance – **Score = 3**
- Earlier curfews/ Not enforcing curfew (1) – **Score = 3**
- Lighting/ Better Lighting (1)/ Lighting, both public and private - **Score = 3**
- Speeding (2)/ Traffic needs to be slowed down - **Score = 3**
- Enforcement of Laws: Codes, Truancy, etc./ Don't back away from "broken window" - **Score = 2**
- Parking/ Parking - **Score = 2**
- Educate about bullying and "no snitch" thinking (1) - **Score = 2**
- Keeping violent criminals behind bars (1) - **Score = 2**
- Shrubbery/ Better tree pruning - **Score = 2**
- Foster welcoming community/ Encourage people to come out on the sidewalk - **Score = 2**
- More "Children at Play" Signs(1) - **Score = 2**
- Gangs (1) - **Score = 2**
-

- Faster turn around time - **Score = 1**
- Quadrant system - **Score = 1**
- Less violence - **Score = 1**
- "Outsiders" create problems - **Score = 1**
